

This month's tour of the USNS Kanawha is bound to be one of our most popular of the year, so reserve your spot early. The USNS Kanawha is a Military Sealift Command (MSC) replenishment oiler. This is a ship specially built for the MSC and is a unique is many areas. It is 677 feet in length with a beam of 97 feet and a displacement of 40,700

tons. It is capable of holding 180,000 barrels of fuel oil or aviation fuel and (8) containers. The twin Colt-Pielstick diesels propel this vessel at 20 knots.

Commissioned in 1990 this vessel serves in the Atlantic feet. This tour, hosted by Boston Ship Repair, will offer you a unique opportunity to see behind the scenes of this unusual mechanical plant.
